Plant mood board

A plant mood board is a visual guide to accompany the planting plan; it is a collection of plant images to showcase the plants and colour combinations used as inspiration to help create your garden. The mood board will provide you with a season of interest list, giving you useful information about their flowering season, changes of foliage colour during the seasons and any other notable features such as whether they produce fruit or interesting seeds and their structure. This detailed information will help you make a more informed decision.

Planting plant

A planting plan is a detailed map of how plants will be arranged in your garden, it shows the location and quantity of each plant, with the name of each specimen, helping to create a well-planned cohesive outdoor space.

What are the benefits of having a planting plan?

Before rushing out to buy plants for your garden, it is important to think about particular colours and styles you want in your garden. Maybe you like the soft subtle colours of a cottage garden or exotic plants with their architectural foliage like bananas and palm trees. Researching planting schemes beforehand will help avoid wasting money on the wrong plants that can lead to disappointment due to them being in the wrong location or make the garden look cluttered and messy, rather than beautiful and cohesive.

When creating a planting plan, I research what plants are best suited to your garden based on your own personal style, I consider the conditions of your garden, such as whether the new plants need sun or shade, what type of soil you have, how you want to use the garden space and if you want low maintenance or prefer to be a 'hands on gardener'.
